This workshop is designed for those professionals who need an introduction to the basic rules of administration, scoring, and interpretation of the WJIII COG Battery and WJIII ACH Battery. This training is designed for those familiar or unfamiliar with the WJ-R. Practitioners would benefit from taking both COG and ACH training even if they administer only one of the batteries. This way each member of the team can more fully appreciate the performance implications. NOTE: Trainees are asked to bring test books, test records, and related test materials to each training session.

Outcomes: Day One-WJIII COG Battery - The participants will:

- Review revision goals, new features, and technical overview.
- Become familiar with CHC Theory of Cognitive Abilities that underlies the WJIII.
- Become familiar with the organization of the battery (General Ability Clusters, Cognitive Factors, and Clinical Clusters).
- Learn general administration and scoring guidelines for the Standard and Extended Batteries.
- Learn the administration and scoring of all tests, with a particular emphasis on tests new to the battery.
- Learn interpretive options for the Standard and Extended Batteries.
- Review the available levels of information, types of scores, and profiles.
- Review a sample narrative and score report.

Day Two-WJIII ACH Battery - The participants will:

- Review revision goals and new features.
- Learn general administration and scoring guidelines for the Standard and Extended Batteries.
- Learn the administration and scoring of all tests, with a particular emphasis on tests new to the battery.
- Learn interpretive options for the Standard and Extended Batteries.
- Review the available levels of information, types of scores, and profiles.
- Review a sample narrative and score report.
