Fostering Independence: Moving From Teacher-Dependence to Independence

What are the basic principles of effective classroom and behavior management? This course will provide attendees with the opportunity to examine the topics of instruction, motivation, and discipline with the goal of developing strategies to synthesize these elements into an effective classroom management style, increasing the time used on instruction. The day will be filled with interactive strategies that prepare participants to create a culture within their classroom that allows students to grow and increase their learning.
