Response to Intervention (RTI) is a framework for defining how a school or district will meet the needs of all their students before they actually fail. Participants in this session will learn what the basic understandings of RTI are and they will learn how the state has defined this framework. They will receive a copy of Maine's Response to Intervention Planning Guide and learn about additional resources available to support schools and districts as they evaluate where they are, plan, and move towards implementation of an RTI framework.

- ♥ Models and suggestions for how one conducts an RTI meeting.
- ♥ An explicit detailing of what RTI is.
- ♥ A better fund of knowledge of how intervention may be delivered in your school.
