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Differentiating With Graphic Organizers: Tools to Foster Critical and Creative Thinking

Graphic organizers have proven to be successful tools for helping students more readily understand and retain information. In this workshop session, teachers take graphic organizers one step further by fostering their students' critical and creative thinking through the use of cognitive graphic organizers. These graphic organizers can improve teaching practices, help differentiate instruction in the classroom, and raise learning outcomes for all students. If you believe all students can, and should, do high-level thinking, this workshop is for you.

By the end of the session, participants will be able to:

- Use a variety of critical-and creative-thinking graphic organizers,
- Reflect on the six different ways to differentiate, using graphic organizers.
- Use rubrics and/or rating scales to provide students with quality feedback specific to the thinking skill.
- Create an activity grid to manage which graphic organizer to use for each purpose.

Presenter: Patti Drapeau is currently an educational consultant and author, and serves as adjunct faculty at the University of Southern Maine. She presents at state and national conferences, and consults nationally. Patti provides workshops and trainings on the following topics: differentiation, critical and creative thinking, integrating curriculum, graphic organizers, and meeting the needs of special populations. She has published three books, *Differentiating With Graphic Organizers - Tools to Foster Critical and Creative Thinking* (Corwin Press, 2009), *Differentiated Instruction - Making It Work* (Scholastic Books, 2004), and, *Great Teaching With Graphic Organizers* (Scholastic Books, 1998).
